Staying under the Suffolk Stars

(aka Camping/ Caravaning/ Motor homing)



Access to the camping field, if arriving in a vehicle, is via the gate at the back of the Museum - enter from the very end of Lockington Road. **Postcode - IP14 1BQ**
(What3Words: *engineers.stove.clicker.*)

Between 1.00pm and 9pm on Friday there will be someone at the gate to welcome you and guide you to your pitch.

ALL other times – ring the festival phone on **07352 422 687** and let us know your arrival time. Text or call 15 minutes before you reach the gate so we have time to get to you.



Vehicles: There is a **5mph** speed limit on site. The campsite is part of the Museum and there will be members of the public on site too.

CARS: Once unloaded, all cars need to be parked outside of the Museum. The most convenient place is the Iliffe Road car park.

CAMPERS/ CARAVANS: once set up on site vehicles need to stay stationary until the end of the festival.

It is really important you **follow the stewards instructions** about where and how to set up so we can protect the land and make sure you avoid getting stuck.

Accessible camping is available next to a hard surface where cars can park, and also within reach of the accessible toilets. Festival volunteers will be able to help you put up your tent and get settled.



Ablutions & Amenities

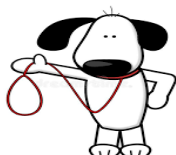


There are toilets, showers, and a drinking water tap on the field, and daytime access to sinks for washing up in the nearby farm barn.

No naked flames are allowed on the campsite. This is because of the extreme risk of fire to the ancient buildings surrounding us. There is a designated cooking area in the field and all flames need to be off the ground. If you are heading to the onsite Feast Café for breakfast this will be available from 9.00.

There are recycling and refuse points available.

Please make sure you leave the site as you found it. We want to be invited back!



Dogs are welcome on site. Please keep them on leads at all times and watch out for when they poop – then you scoop!



Be a good neighbour and keep the noise to a minimum after 10:00pm (unless you are at the festival fire pit telling stories!)



We are hoping for the kind of weather than makes us eat ice cream and warms our bones! Even so, it often gets chilly, especially at night, in the Tithe Barn.

Please bring something warm and cosy like a jumper or your favourite blanket so you can stay cozy during the evening performances in the Tithe Barn.

When it's time to go home/ move on...

All campers need to be **off site by 5 pm** on Sunday. The only exceptions are our wonderful festival volunteers who will still be working after you leave.

If you have an emergency and need to get off site quickly please let the steward on duty know and they will help you/ find you some help.

As you drive up to the gate they will open automatically from the inside (you may need to get quite close)

We hope you enjoy the opportunity to be in a beautiful meadow and exclusively experience the natural spaces of the Food Museum.
